WELCOME TO PIPES 2023

Where were you twenty-five years ago? Some of you might have been knee deep in academic textbooks while others were maybe living elsewhere (at that time, I was living in London). I know some of you were yet to be born and I'm willing to bet that quite a few of you had a lush head of hair (I am gradually joining that camp too, though I prefer to think of it as my hair follicles practicing social distancing!). Maybe a handful of you were fortunate enough to witness the inaugural Pipes of Christmas Concert.

My personal journey with the Pipes of Christmas began about 16 years ago following a serendipitous encounter on NJ Transit. Returning home from my Broadway show, Jersey Boys, I found myself in conversation with a fellow musician wielding a violin case. I discovered he was extremely well versed in Scottish traditional music - for a Scotsman looking for a Celtic connection here in the US, this was like finding the sun in the Scottish Highland sky. This musician was none other than fiddler extraordinaire Paul Woodiel, and as fate would have it, we happened to live in the same town.

One day he mentioned a Celtic Christmas show he was involved with and suggested I might like to join. Now, given my past experiences growing up in the Highlands playing in what I deemed rather 'cheesy' Scottish productions, I wasn't sure about this, but Paul assured me of the concert's authenticity and said, "You must meet Bob Currie".

Well, I met Bob, who's passion for this project won me over, and he hired me to play my first Pipes concert. I have been a part of this amazing musical family ever since - my 13-year-old daughter, Mackenzie, has literally grown up as a member of this extended family. The integrity and quality of this production have left a lasting impression on me, and it is a favourite on my concert schedule.

A few years ago, I found myself inheriting the musical director's baton from the esteemed Jeff Rickard. Filling his shoes was no easy feat but hopefully I have been able to maintain the high standard he set.

Over the years, I've been privileged to compose and arrange many pieces for this remarkable ensemble of musicians. This year, in addition to arranging music by Vangelis and a lively new tune by Eyler Coates, I have written a new song using lyrics from the Carmina Gadelica (pub.1900) and based on a story from the

Hebrides which Bob had found. FISHERMAN'S BLESSING will be sung in Gaelic by Cynthian Knight.

Several years ago, I recorded an album of Celtic music intended for use in TV and film for a production library company. As usual I composed more music than I needed for that project, so some ideas were filed away in the recesses of my mind. One of those unused ideas was a short bagpipe melody which I always felt had some potential. With the Pipes 25th anniversary approaching, the idea of composing a piece for the entire ensemble to commemorate the occasion started to take shape. The more I thought about it, I remembered my old bagpipe tune and realized it was a perfect fit.

My new composition, FICHEAD 'S A CÒIG [pronounced FICH (as in 'Loch')-ID-SA-COE-IK and is Scots Gaelic for '25'] unfolds in three distinct sections played continuously.

- I. AIR A gentle introduction is established by the piano and strings with the cello playing a variation of my old pipe theme.
- II. REELS These reels take on a contemporary feel incorporating unconventional time signatures. For those attempting to count along, the first reel features three measures of 7/4 followed by one measure of 4/4 (7 + 7 + 7 + 4 = 25) see what I did there? As the reel progresses, various interpretations of the main theme intertwine. The second reel introduces yet another variation of the original theme as a kind of fugue, eventually leading to the grand finale.
- III. MARCH It is in this section that my original bagpipe theme, having provided much of the melodic and harmonic material for the preceding sections, is finally played in its entirety with the full ensemble coming together for a triumphant conclusion.

Blending traditional elements with a modern twist, my hope is that this new composition captures the essence of "The Pipes of Christmas".

So, welcome to the 25th Annual Pipes of Christmas Concert filled with an eclectic mix of new material and familiar favourites. Whether you are a returning attendee or experiencing us for the first time, we are glad to have the pleasure of your company and invite you to sit back, relax and enjoy enchanting readings and beautiful music. Here's to another fichead 's a còig - may the pipes play on for another 25 years, and may your hair remain where it belongs!

The Eric Liddell 100 (EL100) is a programme of events and activities to recognise and celebrate the life, sporting and community service achievements of Eric Liddell. It is being planned around 2024, the centenary of his historic success at the 1924 Olympic Games in Paris. Watch this short film which tells you more about The EL100.

The EL100 is led by The Eric Liddell Community, a registered care and specialist dementia charity based in Edinburgh, close to where Eric lived and taught during his time in Scotland. The organisation was established in 1980, and their work is inspired by Eric's values to deliver positive change in their community.

Her Royal Highness The Princess Royal is the Patron of The Eric Liddell 100. The Eric Liddell 100 Aims

- To celebrate Eric Liddell globally, for his exceptional life, values and achievements
- To acknowledge how his outlook shapes how we help people live full lives

- To build on existing international links, and strengthen relationships around the world
- To develop new sporting, business, cultural and educational relationships linked to Eric Liddell's legacy.

These ambitious aims are being delivered in partnership with a wide range of individuals and organisations in Scotland, the UK, Hong Kong, China and the USA. Plans are being developed through three workstreams:

- Educational Development of physical and online resources to support learning in schools, universities and adult learning globally.

- Cultural The creation of an Eric Liddell Exhibition and other cultural celebrations in keeping with his legacy. There are opportunities for the Exhibition to tour mainland China and Hong Kong.

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

The Lord Lyon Society is a Scottish charity established by the Lord Lyon King of Arms, Dr Joe Morrow, CVO. The Lord Lyon King of Arms is the head of the Court of the Lord Lyon, Scotland's heraldic authority, responsible for granting and regulating the use of coats of arms in Scotland. The Court of the Lord Lyon is custodian of the Public Register of All Arms and Bearings in Scotland which was established by an Act of the Scottish Parliament in the year 1672, has been maintained and added by the Court of the Lord Lyon ever since right up to the present day and now runs to some 100 Volumes which are in daily use.

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2023 TNSPIRE AWARD RECIPIENTS

Presented by The Learned Kindred of Currie

The "Inspire Award" was established to recognize individuals who display significant gifts and energy to further the aims of the Learned Kindred of Currie and their cultural arts mission. This year is no exception.

We are delighted to bestow this year's Inspire Award upon two gentlemen to whom this concert owes a great debt. In fact, without their creative genius, there would not be a Pipes of Christmas concert at all.

Pipe Major Kevin Ray Blandford (1963-2023)

Kevin Blandford's love affair with the bagpipe began in his early teens. It was his enthusiasm for Celtic music which turned a young man with a raw talent into one of America's most prominent and accomplished performers and composers.





The original RP Blandford & Son Pipe Band, formed by him in 1986, was named after the family business based in Redlands, California.

He performed at the Learned Kindred of Currie's Kirking of the Tartan services from 1995-1998, won a number of West Coast championship titles and an impressive 2nd place in the 2000 Pipe Band World Championship in Glasgow, Scotland.

It was his outstanding work as a performer and arranger, recognized by Robert Currie, which provided the foundation for the Pipes of Christmas.

Brilliant composer for the bagpipes

During their tenure working together, Blandford and Currie created several compositions including a lament on the death of Diana, Princess of Wales. The tribute to Elizabeth, the Queen Mother, on her passing in 2002 at age 101 was more celebratory in tone, commemorating a life well-lived. But his best-remembered Pipes of Christmas composition came as he watched the terrible events of September 11, 2001, unfold in New York, Pennsylvania and Washington. It was one of the darkest days in American history. His tune Lament for the Lost debuted in that year's Pipes of Christmas concert and was performed again in 2011, to commemorate the 10th anniversary of 9/11.

Jeff Rickard, long-serving Pipes of Christmas Musical Director often worked closely with Kevin. They collaborated, for example, on Amazing Grace: A Collection of Hymns for Bagpipe and Organ (1986) and the original CD, The Pipes of Christmas (1987). It was this CD, acquired by Currie in the 1990's, which inspired the transformation of this brilliant music into a live concert experience.

"When it came to the pipes, Blandford was a painstaking professional."

While Kevin forged his musical reputation as an outstanding musician and composer, he was also a talented choral singer, teacher, an open sea diver and dive instructor.

Following his untimely death in 2003, the San Bernardino County Sun wrote movingly about the influence he had on the lives of others. "If we must put a name on it, a gentle passion might fit. For music, for the ocean and for seeing the worth in other people."

Like his good friend Kevin Blandford, Jeff stepped out on the musical trail at a young age. He describes himself as a "cradle Episcopalian" so it comes as no surprise that he was organist for Ascension Parish Day School at the tender age of 12.

"I was born playing Bach on a keyboard."

Church music, Bach in particular, was his passion and piano and organ lessons came early in life. The bagpipe, thanks to Kevin Blandford, came later. Lavish in the praise for his friend, Jeff said Blandford "taught me how to immerse myself in the music of the bagpipe."

Now the respected Musical Director Emeritus for the Pipes of Christmas, he was, as they say, in at the beginning. As an organist he worked with Kevin Ray Blandford on the original Pipes of Christmas CD, the music which inspired Currie to establish the event enjoyed today.

Jeff led our concert through our first 20 years and then passed the baton over to our current music director, Steve Gibb.

Jeff brought a wealth of musical experience and community involvement to the Pipes of Christmas, which was one of his many roles while he was Director of Choral Activities to the University of Redlands. His choral program — in particular the annual Christmas presentation of the Feast of Lights — gained an international reputation and was in essence a juxtaposition of traditional and contemporary choral works and innovative arrangements.

This talented musician is currently Kapellmeister at Trinity Episcopal Church, Community Chorus of Redlands – St Dunstan's Choir. He also works with the wider Redlands community as musical director for a range of summer musical theatre productions.
